Stirred by an overwhelming recognition that the community lacked cohesion, was virtually invisible in the City, and needed to develop a shared, comprehensive vision for improvement. Consequently, in March 2012, organizational representatives made a public commitment to participate in a process of change and crafted the following overarching goals to serve as its purpose statement:

Establish a common vision and mission for the Chicago Native American community;

Develop a comprehensive service and development model for the urban setting;

Move towards collaborative community relationships internally and externally; and

Promote understanding and respect for our culture and communities including the social, economic and spiritual spheres.
